Welcome to the Town of Little Elm and Little Elm Park. Little Elm Park is located on Lake Lewisville in Little Elm, TX. The address of the park is 701 W. Eldorado Parkway, Little Elm, TX 75068.

Little Elm Park has many amenities to offer, in addition to tent camping. Some of our amenities are: playground, pavilion with grill (reservations available), amphitheater (reservations available), boat ramp (fees apply), swim beach with concessions, sand volleyball, athletic fields, picnic areas, and hiking/biking trails.

We hope you enjoy your stay at Little Elm Park.

Camping Reservations

Little Elm Park requires a permit for tent camping and can be obtained at our on-site kiosk. A permit can be denied or revoked at any time by the Parks & Recreation Director or designee. Each tent in your party requires a permit.

\$5.00 Overnight Permit/per tent

\$15.00 4-Consecutive Nights Permit/per tent (maximum 4 nights in a 30-day period)

****Special Event pricing may apply.****

Regulations

- ⇒ Primitive camping is available for tent camping only.
- ⇒ Camping in designated areas only. No campers, vans or similar house vehicles are permitted.
- ⇒ Motorized vehicles shall park in the lot provided and not at the campsite.
- ⇒ Camping is available by permit only and are not transferable. Permit receipts must be kept at your tent at all times during your stay.
- ⇒ The placement of camping equipment on a campsite or intermittent personal appearance at a campsite for the purpose of reserving a designated campsite for future occupancies is prohibited.
- ⇒ Campers shall keep their campsites free of trash and litter during the period of occupancy and shall clean their campsites and remove all personal equipment upon departure.
- ⇒ Digging or leveling of any ground or the construction of any structure without written permission of the Parks & Recreation Director is prohibited.

Conservation

Please take care to respect all of the natural resources present on park property. Make preserving the beauty of Little Elm Park a top priority during your stay.



- ⇒ Please do not climb onto or swing from any tree or vine. Please do not nail items to trees.

Campfires

Gathering around a blazing campfire is nice, but if proper precautions are not followed, it can become dangerous.



Never leave a fire unattended.

- ⇒ Campers should bring their own approved fire pit. Fires are not permitted on the ground or in hand-made fire rings.
- ⇒ Campers should bring their own firewood.
- ⇒ Campers are not permitted to cut standing wood, dead or alive. Gathering of firewood is prohibited.
- ⇒ Please do not dump hot coals or ashes on the ground or in any trash receptacle.
- ⇒ Prior to starting a campfire, please check Burn Ban restrictions at (940) 349-2840.

Pets

Pets are allowed in campsite areas and must be kept on a leash or under physical restraint at all times. Please clean-up after your pet.

Trash

Trash and recycle receptacles are provided throughout the park. All trash must be carried to trash receptacles.

Obtaining a Permit

Camping permits can be obtained at our on-site kiosk, located along the fence at the north side of the camping area. The kiosk accepts exact cash or a credit card. Note the kiosk does not give change. *Special Event policies may apply.*

Your receipt should be kept readily available at your campsite, in case of inquiries by Parks staff or a police officer.
