Little Elm Early Voting times and locations announced *Three Town Council races on tap, one unopposed*

LITTLE ELM (March 23, 2015) Residents of Little Elm will have chosen a Mayor and two Town Council members after polls close on Saturday, May 9, says Town Secretary Kathy Phillips.

“The Town portion of the ballot will contain the three Council races,” she said. “There are two candidates for Mayor, two candidates for the Place 5 seat, but only one candidate for the Place 3 seat. That candidate will be declared elected.”

Election is May 9, but Early Voting begins on Monday April 27, and continues through May 5. Registered Little Elm residents may vote early in the Program Room of the Little Elm Public Library on the first floor of the Little Elm Town Hall building, 100 West Eldorado Parkway.

From Monday, April 27 to Saturday, May 2, the Early Voting polling place will open at 8 a.m. and close at 5 p.m. There is no Early Voting on Sunday, May 3. On Monday, May 4 and Tuesday, May 5, the polls will open at 7 a.m. and remain open until 7 p.m.

In addition to the Little Elm Public Library, residents may cast their ballot at other early voting locations in Denton County. Details can be found on the Denton County web site <http://elections.dentoncounty.com> and on the front page of Town web site www.littleelm.org.

On Election Day, May 9, voting will occur from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Locations for casting ballots on May 9 will soon be listed on the front page of the Little Elm Town web site.

Those eligible individuals who wish to vote but are not yet registered, have until Thursday, April 9 to register.

On the ballot for the Mayoral race are Curtis J. Cornelious and David Hillock. Cornelious is the current Mayor Pro Tem and is ineligible to run for his current Place 3 seat because of term limits. Hillock is the incumbent Mayor.

The sole candidate for Place 3 is Neil Blais. In Place 5, incumbent Council member Katie Gipson has decided not to seek reelection. Candidates for that position include Tyler Hook and Nick Musteen.

ABOUT LITTLE ELM – Little Elm is one of the state’s fastest growing communities. Nestled on the shores of Lake Lewisville, the Town was incorporated in 1966, adopting the Council/Manager form of government. The population increased dramatically over the last several years, growing from under 4,000 in 2000 to over 30,000 today. Little Elm’s population exceeds the state average in education and income, and is increasingly trending younger and technologically proficient. The Town’s footprint is just over 14 square miles and boasts some 66 linear miles of shoreline within its boundaries.
