## Little Elm Rec Center offers half-price memberships *Annual family membership offer ends on June 15*

LITTLE ELM (June 5, 2015) For many Little Elm residents, the goal of shedding a little excess in anticipation of warmer weather and the accompanying sparser wardrobe becomes easier to accomplish with the return of half-price memberships to the Little Elm Recreation Center.

Between now and June 15, Little Elm residents can purchase an annual family membership for \$210 and non-residents pay only \$325, both half of the usual annual fee. The Little Elm Recreation Center is located at 303 Main St., a block north of Eldorado Parkway.

Memberships in this category entitle every member of the immediate family access to the many programs, equipment, and facilities at the center, including a safe and secure Kidzone child watch center for children 18 months to 12 years.

Amenities available for use include an extremely accommodating schedule of group fitness classes, a full court gymnasium, fitness room and shower facilities. A well-trained, friendly and patient staff, devoted to maintaining a clean and well-maintained facility, is available to answer questions regarding general health and wellness. Unless otherwise noted, the center is open seven days a week.

Jogging and hiking trails are nearby for those who want to include an outdoor element to their workout. Meeting rooms can be reserved at an additional cost for small events, and specialized classes are offered throughout the year, most for an additional fee.

**ABOUT LITTLE ELM** – Little Elm is one of the state’s fastest growing communities. Nestled on the shores of Lake Lewisville, the Town was incorporated in 1966, adopting the Council/Manager form of government. The population increased dramatically over the last several years, growing from under 4,000 in 2000 to over 30,000 today. Little Elm’s population exceeds the state average in education and income, and is increasingly trending younger and technologically proficient.
