Economic Development Corporation seeking members *Three Board of Director positions open*

LITTLE ELM (August 13, 2015) The Little Elm Economic Development Corporation, the lead agency that deals with companies and organizations seeking to relocate into the Town, has begun accepting applications for membership on their Board of Directors, says Executive Director Jennette Killingsworth.

“We have three positions coming up for appointment,” she said. “One is for a one-year term to complete the unexpired term of a person who is moving, and two are for regular two-year terms.” The open positions are filled by Town Council appointment.

The Little Elm Economic Development Corporation is chartered by the State of Texas as a 4A Corporation, so named for the section of the enabling legislation that created the EDC structure at the municipal level.

Members of the EDC board are entrusted with the task of recruiting, retaining and entering into legal agreements with firms, companies, organizations and enterprises that serve to increase the local tax base and create jobs within Little Elm.

Among the most striking examples of the results of their work include the enticement of Hula Hut, Holt Machinery, Alamo Draffhouse, and a whole host of entertainment, retail, commercial and service companies to Little Elm.

Interested individuals must have been residents of Little Elm for a minimum of one year, be of high moral character and be willing to devote time, effort, expertise and energy to the position.

Deadline for submitting applications for consideration is 5 p.m., Tuesday, Sept. 1. Individuals who qualify for consideration will undergo interviews with a panel which includes the Mayor, a member of the Town Council and the EDC treasurer. Interviews will occur on Thursday, Sept. 10 starting at 4 p.m. Each qualifying applicant will be notified of their specific interview time by the EDC staff.

ABOUT LITTLE ELM – Little Elm is one of the state’s fastest growing communities. Nestled on the shores of Lake Lewisville, the Town was incorporated in 1966, adopting the Council/Manager form of government. The population increased dramatically over the last several years, growing from under 4,000 in 2000 to over 30,000 today. Little Elm’s population exceeds the state average in education and income, and is increasingly trending younger and technologically proficient. The Town’s footprint is just over 21 square miles and boasts some 66 linear miles of shoreline within its boundaries.
